Provides transitional housing that is rent-free and utilityfree for 3 months. Each family and/or individual works hard to pay off debt, save money and learn valuable life skills.

HOPE OPPORTUNITIES

This program encourages graduates to participate in community engagement, self-improvement, and other positive activities both for themselves and their children with incentives such as financial assistance for gas, childcare, and rent- that continue to bring support and stability into their lives.

HOPE SOLUTIONS

Providing eviction prevention in the form of a 6 month program of financial support paired with resourcebuilding, budgeting, and guidance to regain stability.




